

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-08
Extending the City of Tyler's Local Declaration of a State of Emergency

A Resolution enacted under authority of Minnesota Statutes Sections 12.29 and 12.37 to extend the period of mayor-declared emergency.

Whereas, the Mayor of Tyler found that the following situation exists:

The infectious disease known as COVID-19, an act of nature, has been detected in at least 140 countries and territories, including the United States. COVID-19 has been reported in 49 states with 60 confirmed cases in Minnesota.

Whereas, the Mayor found that the situation is sudden and unforeseen and could not have been anticipated;

Whereas, the Mayor finds necessary the need to comply with recommendations from the President of the United States, the Governor of Minnesota, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the Minnesota Department of Health to better mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on the public and health care systems;

Whereas, the Mayor finds that this situation threatens the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the community;


Whereas, the Mayor finds that the situation could result in an unknown number of infections if not immediately addressed; and

Whereas, the City Council of Tyler agrees with the Mayor's findings and further finds that the situation will last for more than three days;


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TYLER, MINNESOTA AS FOLLOWS:

1. The city council declares that the situation constitutes a local emergency continuing until the fourth of May 2020.
2. This declaration of a local emergency will invoke the city's emergency response plans and policies. The portions that are necessary for response to and recovery from the emergency must be used.
