Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Boost Grant

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Department of Transportation Safe Routes to School Program assists schools and communities by making it so youth in Minnesota can safely, confidently, and conveniently walk, bike, and roll to school and in daily life.; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Department of Transportation Safe Routes to School Program solicits applications to enable school and communities to implement Safe Routes to School planning, implementation, and programmatic activities; and

WHEREAS, if the City of Tyler was awarded Boost funds these grant funds would be used to provide implementation activities to local communities to develop Safe Routes to School initiatives that increase safety and encourage more children to walk and bicycle to school; and


WHEREAS; No local match funding is required; and

WHEREAS; SRTS programmatic activities will commence after the grant agreement is fully executed.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:


1. That the City of Tyler authorizes the City Administrator to enter into a grant agreement with the Minnesota Department of Transportation for financial assistance to fund a Safe Routes to School program and eligible expenses.
2. That the City Administrator is authorized to execute such Agreement and any amendments without further approval by the Tyler City Council.
